WHAT FAMILIES CAN EXPECT

- All Pack leaders are registered with the Northern Star Scouting, which includes Pack approval, completion of Youth Protection training every 2 years, and criminal background checks
- All event attendees, whether a scout, leader or parent or guest must comply with the Youth Protection rules published nationally (available upon request)
- **All of our events are open! You are always able to attend the event with your Cub Scouts.** In fact, we require parent/guardian attendance for events, particularly with younger Cub Scouts.
- All events will have **at least 2 registered leaders** to ensure a safe scouting environment.
- There is **no one-on-one contact** between youth and adults.
- Adult leaders and youth members have a responsibility to recognize, respond to, and report All Youth Protection violations and abuse including, mandatory reporting to law enforcement.
- As part of its "Scouts First" approach to the protection and safety of youth, the BSA has established a dedicated 24-hour helpline to receive reports of known or suspected abuse or behavior that might put a youth at risk. 1-844-SCOUTS1 (1-844-726-8871)



RESOURCES FOR FAMILIES

- Each year, one of the requirements is for parent/guardians to talk with their Scout using an age-appropriate guide to preventing child abuse.
- The Guide for Safe Scouting covers age-appropriate activities and how to have a great program while preventing injuries.
- BSA has enhanced the Youth Protection Training to include training on bullying awareness and prevention
- Scout adventures using the internet require a review of internet safety rules
- Any adult is encouraged to take the Youth Protection training -- each leader has taken this training within the last 24 months as part of being a leader
